

UA Will Spend \$30 Million Making 6 Films in Great Britain

LONDON (AP)—United Artists has announced it will make six major new movies in Britain. The London Evening Standard estimated the cost at \$30 million. "This is excellent news for British film technicians and studios," said Charles Berman, deputy managing director of United Artists' British subsidiary, United Artists Corp. Ltd.

Prime Minister Harold Wilson gave the British movie industry a shot in the arm last week by announcing \$10 million in government aid to film-makers.

The six new films are "The Pink Panther Strikes Again," starring Peter Sellers as the clumsy Inspector Clouseau; "The Spy Who Loved Me," a James Bond thriller starring Roger Moore; the screen version of Frederick Forsyth's best-selling "The Dogs of War"; "Valentino," in which ballet star Rudolf Nureyev makes his acting debut as silent film idol Rudolph Valentino; "Equus," a film version of the Broadway play, and "The Cooler" from George Markstein's novel.
